1. Purpose and Commitment

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all employees, contractors, interns, and volunteers at **Shifaa Serenity Therapy Solutions, LLC** understand and comply with their legal and ethical obligations as **mandated reporters**. Protecting children, elders, dependent adults, and animals from abuse, neglect, or exploitation is both a professional and legal responsibility in many states.

2. Scope of Application

This policy applies to:

- Licensed and unlicensed clinical staff
- Administrative staff who become aware of reportable concerns
- Interns and trainees under supervision
- Contractors and volunteers working with clients

3. What Must Be Reported

Mandated reporters must file a report when they know of, suspect, or reasonably believe that a client or vulnerable individual has experienced:

- Child abuse or neglect
- Elder abuse or neglect
- Abuse or neglect of dependent/vulnerable adults
- Sexual abuse or exploitation
- Imminent risk of harm to self or others
- Animal abuse or neglect, where required by state law

4. Reporting Animal Abuse

4.1 Rationale

Research shows a strong connection between animal cruelty and interpersonal violence (child abuse, domestic violence, elder abuse). For this reason, several states mandate or encourage mental health professionals to report suspected animal abuse.

4.2 State-Specific Guidance

- Staff must be aware of and comply with **state laws regarding animal abuse reporting** in the state where they are licensed and practicing.
- In states where reporting is mandated, suspected or confirmed cases of animal abuse must be reported to the appropriate animal welfare agency, animal control authority, or law enforcement.
- In states where reporting is not mandated but permitted, staff are strongly encouraged to report concerns consistent with professional judgment.

4.3 Client Notification

Clients should be informed that disclosures of animal abuse may be reportable under state law and are an exception to confidentiality.

5. Standards for Reporting

5.1 Duty to Report

- Reports must be made **immediately** or as soon as practically possible upon knowledge or suspicion of abuse (human or animal).
- Staff may not delegate reporting responsibility to another person.

5.2 Method of Reporting

- Contact the designated state child, adult, or animal protective services hotline.
- Submit required written reports within the timeline mandated by state law.
- In emergencies, call **911** for immediate intervention.

5.3 Confidentiality

- Mandated reporting takes precedence over confidentiality.
- Clients must be informed of these exceptions during intake and at relevant times in treatment.

6. Staff Responsibilities

- Stay updated on state-specific reporting requirements, including animal abuse obligations.
- Notify a supervisor after making a report (while maintaining client confidentiality).
- Document the report in the client's record, including date, time, agency contacted, and summary of the concern.

7. Organizational Responsibilities

- Provide **annual training** on mandated reporting, including state-specific requirements for child, elder, adult, and animal abuse.
- Maintain updated contact information for all hotlines and reporting agencies.
- Support staff through the reporting process while ensuring compliance.

8. Legal Protections

- Mandated reporters are granted immunity from liability when making reports in good faith.
- Failure to report may result in **legal penalties**, fines, disciplinary action, and/or loss of licensure.

9. Enforcement

Non-compliance with mandated reporting responsibilities (human or animal) will result
in disciplinary action, termination, and possible referral to licensing boards or legal
authorities.
